 - 1. To summarize the cash flow for the first fiscal quarter we received \$65,472.22 in income from dues and event income and \$42,224.81 in total expenses. This gives us a net profit for the year of \$23,247.41. In a large part, the profit was a result of a very successful Spring Conference in 2013.
 - 2. I adjusted budgets for the current year based on the communication I received from the committee members. I have a two percent increase in magazine budget and I have added a new item for promotions.
